## POINTE-CLAIRE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

The Pointe-Claire Horticultural Society is a non-profit association whose aim is to foster interest in all types of gardening.

The Society meets at 7:30 p.m., on the fourth Wednesday of the month except May (3<sup>rd</sup> Wed.). No monthly meetings in June, July, August and December.

We have guest speakers (either in-house or virtually) and hold various events throughout the year. This may include a plant sale, a plant exchange, members' garden tours and an outing.

Meetings are conducted in English. Virtual meetings are held via Zoom. In house meetings are held at: ***St. Columba by-the-lake Church, 11 Rodney Ave., Pointe-Claire, QC*** (parking on Vincennes)

The annual family membership is \$20.00. Visitors are asked to pay \$5.00 for each event/meeting they attend.

After August 31st a family membership is \$10.00 for the balance of the calendar year.

Members are entitled to a discount at certain local nurseries. Bring your membership card.

## LA SOCIÉTÉ D'HORTICULTURE DE POINTE-CLAIRE

La société d'horticulture de Pointe-Claire est une association à but non lucratif qui a comme objectif d'encourager la pratique de tous les types de jardinage.

Ses membres se réunissent généralement le quatrième mercredi du mois à 19h 30 tous les mois sauf en mai et juin (3<sup>e</sup> mercredi). Il n'y a aucune réunion mensuelle en juin, juillet, août et décembre.

La Société invite des conférenciers et organise plusieurs événements chaque année. Généralement, au cours de l'année, ces événements comprennent une vente de plantes, un échange de plantes, des visites de jardins des membres et une excursion.

Les réunions, qui se déroulent en anglais, ont lieu en personne à :

## HISTORY OF THE SOCIETY

The Valois area of Pointe-Claire was settled in part by people who brought their love of gardening with them. A small group of these gardeners decided to attract kindred spirits by forming a gardening society. In the early spring of 1933, the Valois Citizen's Association appointed a committee, under Chairman Thomas Dick, for the purpose of encouraging gardening in the neighbourhood. The result of the committee's work was the formation of the Valois Horticultural Society in May 1934.

The Society began to hold monthly meetings at the Church of the Resurrection on Mount Pleasant Ave. and flower and vegetable shows were held. Garden competitions also took place in which members could enter their gardens in different categories. The fledgling Society's motto was "Have a Garden This Year."

When Valois was incorporated into the City of Pointe-Claire, the Valois Horticultural Society decided to follow suit and became the Pointe-Claire Horticultural Society (PCHS). Around 1966/67, the Lakeshore Rose and Bloom Show was initiated. This annual event brought three West Island horticultural societies - Pointe-Claire, Beaconsfield and Dorval - together in lively competition until 2001. It was held solely by Pointe-Claire until 2019.

In May 1999 PCHS held the first of what has now become an annual spring plant sale in the park opposite the Valois train station.

### **AND NOW:**

When the Church of the Resurrection found a new landlord in November of 2019, the PCHS found a new home at St. Columba by-the-Lake church. We met in the church hall for a few months - - until Covid-19 closed all social activities. Thanks to social media we have not lost touch with our membership and our Program Committee has found a diverse group of lecturers from throughout Canada to entertain and inform us on our usual Wednesday evening meetings. Covid-19 has been a bit of a boon to our club as many people sought gardening as an outlet. As a consequence, our membership is now up to 144 people and they come from many different communities - - one doesn't have to live in Pointe Claire to become a member.

The Pointe-Claire Horticultural Society is now 88 years young (2022) and we hope celebrate this anniversary in person this year. Come join the fun and bring a friend or two - - new members and visitors are always welcome. We encourage our members to try new approaches to gardening by offering a stimulating diverse program. Our Program Committee is searching for new and interesting speakers and plan to hold our annual plant sale, garden tours, plant exchange and we may even squeeze in a design competition or flower contest. In addition, we are working on an outing to new destinations where we hope to find new ideas and plants to work into our gardens.

Brown who told us about Vertical Veggies, Hazel Cook of Blossom Hill Nursery who promoted their prize-winning Delphiniums and how to grow them, Heinke Theissen who took us on a tour of Gardens of Ireland and a great favourite presenter Paul Zammit who showed us how to garden without flowers. All of these lectures, with the exception of Annie Martin who managed to meet with us just prior to shut-down, were held with the help of Google Meet and Zoom. We were also offered the chance to view other presentations arranged by both Beaconsfield and the Hudson garden clubs, some were just great and the one from Australia was fantastic.

Our thanks go out to all who organized these events, who opened their gardens on the tours, who cared for the Paradise Project flower bed and who volunteered to help.

## *FOR DONATIONS OF PLANT STOCK TO PCHS SALES EVENTS*

**PERENNIALS:** Cleaned, healthy plant stock that is a credit to you as a gardener.

- Potted in good soil and weed-free (preferably, prepared a couple of weeks prior to sale to establish the plant),
- Labelled with useful information: i.e. name, flower colour, height, sun/moisture requirements, etc.

**ANNUALS:** Healthy flower, fruit or vegetable seedlings that you are willing to donate.

A bus tour of different public or private gardens and/or nurseries. Details will be announced upon confirmation of the itinerary.

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## MEMBERS' GARDEN TOURS

AUGUST 14, 2022

Join us in an afternoon stroll around 5 or 6 gardens that have been generously opened to society members and invited guests.

Please plan on paying \$5.00 for each of the non-member friends you invite.
